2013 OPEN BURNING WINDOW SET

THE UTAH STATE DIVISION OF AIR QUALITY HAS ESTABLISHED AN OPEN BURNING WINDOW FOR THE BURNING OF YARD WASTE ONLY THROUGHOUT JUAB COUNTY *FROM: MARCH 30, 2013 THROUGH: MAY 30TH, 2013.*

Open Burning Permits must be applied for online at the Utah Division of Air Quality Website at: <http://www.airquality.utah.gov/Compliance/OpenBurning/index.htm> at least 3 days in advance of the anticipated burn.

After the burn permit application is completed and submitted, a copy is sent electronically to the county or municipal fire authority having jurisdiction in the area where the open burning will take place. The applicable county or municipal fire authority is the permit issuing authority and no burning is allowed without an approved burn permit.

If completing the open burn permit application online is not an option, a hard copy of the application may be completed and submitted by mail to the DAQ for electronic processing. To request a hard copy of the open burn permit application, contact the DAQ by phone at (801) 536-4000. *Please note: it may take up to 14 days from the date of request to receive an open burn permit if a hard copy is submitted for processing.*

All open burning is subject to the conditions of the approved burn permit and the following laws and requirements:

The following conditions shall be met for all approved open burning permits:

1. Approved burning allows residents to burn only clippings, bushes, plants, grass, leaves, limbs and other prunings. State Law (R307-202) prohibits burning of household waste, construction and demolition waste, milled lumber of any kind, cardboard, trash, cloth, rubbish, tires, plastics, chemicals or liquid fuels and petroleum products. Petroleum products may not be used to start fires.
2. Materials to be burned must be thoroughly dry.
3. State Law (R307-202-7(10)(ii) requires the Utah Clearing Index be verified which must be above 500 when burning. The Clearing Index can be obtained by telephone at: **1-801-524-5133** or via the Internet at: http://www.wrh.noaa.gov/slc/projects/ifp/html/webSMF_new.php
4. State Law (65A-8-9) requires that you notify your city police department (if they have a dispatch service) or the Sheriff's dispatch at: 435-623-1349 prior to any burning and inform them of your intent to burn. Failure to notify of the burning is a class B misdemeanor and you may be liable for Fire response costs. Notification is required for all agricultural burns.
5. Burning shall not be conducted within 50 feet of any structure or combustible material.
6. All flammable vegetation shall be cleared within a 10-foot radius of fire.
7. Persons burning shall have a garden hose available and connected to a water supply or approved fire extinguishing equipment shall be available during the burning.
8. Burning material shall be constantly attended by a responsible adult until the fire has been extinguished.
9. There shall be no burning at night.

When authorized to burn, please be considerate of your neighbors. Be aware of smoke drifting towards and into your neighbors' homes. If the Fire Department is asked to respond, and if it is determined that the fire is a nuisance, the Fire Department will extinguish the fire.

The burning permit does not relieve an individual from personal liability due to neglect or incompetence. Any person burning has a responsibility to establish adequate fire breaks and to take whatever other measures are necessary to insure that the fire is properly controlled. If the fire spreads to another person's property, the person starting the fire shall be responsible for payment of the costs of the suppression action and may also be liable for damages to the other person's property.

The period from: June 1st through: October 31st annually is designated as a closed Fire Season by the State of Utah. Written Burn permits are required during the "ANNUAL CLOSED FIRE SEASON" and will be issued only in very limited circumstances such as when considered necessary and safe to mitigate fire threat and risk to life and/or property.

As per Eureka City Ordinance No. 980 An Ordinance regulating the licensing and control of dogs and other animals within Eureka City Section 13-242 License and Registration Required:

It is unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or maintain any dog six or more months old unless such dog has been registered and licensed with Eureka City. Anyone owning, keeping, harboring, or maintaining three or more dogs over the age of six months shall be considered operating a dog kennel and shall be required to pay an annual kennel license fee of \$25.00 per year upon approval by City Council

**REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT
ON
CULINARY WATER & WASTE WATER BONDS**

Dear Residential Users:

Eureka City (hereinafter "City") has applied to USDA Rural Development, US Army Corps, Utah Community Impact Board, Utah Division of Water Quality, and the Utah Division of Drinking Water for grants and loans to be used for the construction of culinary water system improvements and waste water system improvements for the City.

The culinary water system improvements include the construction of a 400,000 gallon concrete storage tank, the drilling of a new well, the replacement of asbestos piping as well as the placement of additional piping totaling 30,000 linear feet, improvements to the booster system, installation of additional valves and hydrants, and the installation of a new metering system.

The waste water improvements include the replacement of approximately 30,000 linear feet of failing pipe, the placement of an additional 3,600 linear feet of collection pipe, the installation of approximately 40 manholes, and improvements to the Treatment System for monitoring and management purposes.

The estimated culinary water project cost is \$4,800,000. The waste water project cost is estimated at \$6,600,000 with a combined total improvements project cost of \$11,200,000. The proposed funding for the project is estimated at 75% grant, and 25% loan.

In order to pay the new bond indebtedness (loan) the City is estimating average culinary water and waste water fees could be as follows:

Average Monthly Culinary Water Rate -	\$56.00
Average Monthly Waste Water Rate -	\$45.00

The Town will hold a public hearing at the City Hall on Tuesday April 16, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. to receive public comment on funding the proposed sewer and water projects. Anyone wishing to submit written comment may do so any time prior to the public hearing. Written comments should be addressed to:

Luck and Superstitions

Do you remember as a child carrying around a *rabbit's foot on a key chain to bring you good luck?* Or *worrying about stepping on a crack (in the sidewalk) and breaking your mother's back?* There were many unique superstitions that were passed down during our childhood that we faithfully observed without knowing why.

Some superstitions were really strange like *breaking a mirror means seven years of bad luck.* Or *if a black cat crosses your path, it brings you misfortune.* I never could figure out why *if you spilled some salt, you had to throw more salt over your left shoulder.* All you got was a bigger mess.

The dictionary defines **SUPERSTITION** as *an irrational but usually deep-seated belief in the magical effects of a particular action or ritual, especially in the likelihood that good or bad luck will result from performing it.* Also called **old wives tales, folklore, taboos,** and **omens,** they included such ideas as **Friday the 13th** was an *unlucky day.* Numerologists believed that 12 was a complete number but 13 was associated with bad luck. I'm not sure when we let go of these strange childhood beliefs. I know my husband and I met at a dance on Friday the 13th and have considered it lucky ever since.
