SENATE CHAMBER,

Salt Lake City, Utah, March 8, 1948.

Pursuant to a Proclamation issued by His Excellency, Governor Herbert B. Maw, the Senate of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Utah met in the First Special Session in the Senate Chamber at the State Capitol at 12 o'clock noon.

The Senate was called to order by President Hopkin.

Roll call—All Senators present.

Prayer by the Chaplain.

Secretary of State Heber Bennion, Jr., read the following proclamation:

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF UTAH

## A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Public Assistance laws of the State of Utah are inadequate to provide for the minimum requirements of the aged and needy of the State, and much suffering is resulting therefrom; and

WHEREAS, this extraordinary condition makes the calling of a special session of the Legislature of the State of Utah advisable;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HERBERT B. MAW, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 6 of Article 7 of the Constitution of Utah, do, by this proclamation, call the Legislature of the State into special session at the Capitol on the 8th day of March 1948, at twelve noon for the following purposes:

**FIRST**—To consider the matter of amending the Public Welfare laws of the State and to provide for the adequate administration of a public welfare program :

**SECOND**—To make appropriations to cover the expenses of a special session; and

**THIRD**—To consider whatever other matters are presented to the special session by the Governor.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Utah.

**COMMUNICATION FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL**

Dear Senator Knight:

Reference is made to your communication of March 2, 1948, wherein you request an opinion as to whether or not it will be neces-

sary for the Governor to submit to the Special Session of the Legislature called for March 8, 1948, nominations for confirmation to offices wherein vacancies occurred since the last session of the Legislature and for which offices interim appointments were made by the Governor.

Section 10 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Utah, insofar as it relates to this problem, reads:

"If, during the recess of the Senate, a vacancy occur in any State or district office, the Governor shall appoint some fit person to discharge the duties thereof *until the next meeting of the Senate*, when he shall nominate some person to fill such office. \* \*"

The only question for determination is as to whether or not the phrase "next meeting of the Senate" means the meeting of the Senate in a special as well as a regular session, or whether or not such phraseology refers only to a meeting of the Senate in regular session and excludes a meeting of the Senate in a special session.

This office has previously held that the term of an interim appointee expires as quickly as the Senate at its next meeting acts either favorably or unfavorably upon a nominee for the unexpired term and in any event not later than the end of the Legislative session where the Governor either refuses or neglects to submit a name to the Senate for appointment to the unexpired term. (See the opinion of this office dated March 3, 1947, to the Honorable Milton Twitchell.) Hence, with regard to the terms of the interim appointees appointed to fill vacancies occurring during the recess of the Senate, these terms of office will expire at least at the end of the special Legislative session which has now been called and prior thereto if during that session the Senate should act upon a nomination for the unexpired term of the offices in question.

A review of the cases and authorities with regard to the power of appointment in connection with state offices discloses the rule to be unanimous that a Governor of a state has only such appointive powers as are specifically given to him by the Constitution or Statutes of that state, and that in filling vacancies in office such Constitutional and Statutory provisions must be followed very closely. See 42 Am. Jur. Page 951, Section 93; page 981, Section 141; page 982, Section 142. As pointed out by many cases and authorities, the purpose for such a provision as regards requiring senatorial confirmation of gubernatorial appointees is to give the people of the state, through their elected representatives in the Senate the power to appraise persons chosen by the Governor to fill public offices and to determine whether or not they concur with the Governor in the belief that such person is fit and qualified to perform the functions of such office. With this purpose in mind let us consider the language of Section 10 of Article VII above quoted. Obviously it is important that state offices not go unfilled. Under our system of government the Legislature is not in session at all times. Hence, it became important that provision be made for the filling of vacancies during recess of the Senate. On the other hand, in view of the recognized wholesome purpose in having the Senate pass upon and determine the

qualifications of persons appointed to public office, provision was made that the people's representatives, namely the members of the State Senate, should consider such fitness and qualifications at the earliest possible date after the appointments are made, namely at the "next meeting of the Senate."

Section 6 of Article VII of the Constitution of Utah provides as follows:

"On extraordinary occasions, the Governor may convene the Legislature by proclamation, in which shall be stated the purpose for which the Legislature is to be convened, and it shall transact no legislative business except that for which it was especially convened, or such other legislative business as the Governor may call to its attention while in session. The Legislature, however, may provide for the expenses of the session and other matters incidental thereto. The Governor may also by proclamation convene the Senate in extraordinary session for the transaction of executive business."

It is uniformly held, however, that the confirmation of gubernatorial appointees by the Senate is not "Legislative business," but is an administrative or executive act. See *State vs. Williams*, 222 Mo. 268; also 42 Am. Jur., Public Officers, Section 113. Hence, the fact that the Legislative call does not refer to the confirmation of appointees to state offices does not exclude the Senate from considering such nominations for confirmation nor does it relieve the Governor from the duty of submitting names of nominees to fill vacancies occurring during the Senate's recess. Section 113 of the Title on Public Offices, of 42 Am. Jur. reads in part as follows:

"As stated above, confirmation by the Senate of appointments made by the Governor is not a Legislative Act. Consequently such confirmation may be made as well at a special as at a regular session and it is immaterial for what purpose the Legislative Body may have been called in session, for whenever that body is lawfully convened for Legislative purposes, it has the right to act for administrative purposes, even without mention of such purposes in the call for a special session."

It should likewise be noted from Section 6 of Article VII above quoted that the Governor may by proclamation bring the Senate in extraordinary session for the transaction of executive business. Hence the Senate might meet, without the entire Legislature being called into session for Legislative purposes. It is pertinent to note that Section 10 of Article VII does not refer to the next meeting of the Legislature, but requires nomination to fill vacancies to be made at the "next meeting of the Senate."

This provision is in the same Article of the Constitution as the provision providing for the calling of the Senate into extraordinary session. Certainly it must be presumed that the framers of the Constitution were aware of these two provisions and should it have been

the intention of the framers of the Constitution to provide that nominations to fill such vacancies need be submitted for confirmation only to the Senate when meeting in regular session, such would have been stated.

One of the cardinal rules of Statutory and Constitutional interpretation is that language should be construed in its commonly understood and accepted meaning. With this rule in mind it is difficult for us to construe the phrase "next meeting of the Senate" to mean meetings of the Senate in regular session only.

There has been some reference in the press to Section 87-2-2 with the suggestion that such section might have a bearing upon the question presented by you. That section reads as follows:

"Within ten days after the meeting of the legislature, the governor must transmit to the senate a list of all appointments made by him under the provisions of the constitution or of law during the recess of the legislature."

This office has heretofore on other occasions held that such section has no relationship whatsoever to the nomination for Senate confirmation of persons to fill vacancies in state office. As we have pointed out in previous opinions the provisions of Section 87-2-2 require the Governor to transmit to the Senate a list of appointments made by him during the recess of the Legislature. This list of appointments is submitted only for the information of the Legislature and to inform that body as to who have been serving as its public officers as interim appointees. Such names are not submitted for the purpose of confirmation and of course the persons appointed to serve as interim appointees might not even be the same ones as those whom the Governor might choose to nominate for Senate confirmation to fill unexpired terms.

As stated in the opinion of this office dated March 3, 1947, to Commissioner Milton Twitchell of the Tax Commission there is no requirement that an interim appointee be submitted to the Senate for confirmation. There would be no reason for such confirmation as his appointment, in the absence of any statutory provision, extends only to the next meeting of the Senate, when the Governor must nominate a person to fill the unexpired term. The Governor sends the names of interim appointees to the Legislature only for the information of the Legislature. The submission of a nominee for confirmation by the Senate is entirely separate and apart from a submission of a list of persons holding interim appointments required to be furnished to the Legislature under the provisions of Section 87-2-2 above. In any event an Act of the Legislature, such as Section 87-2-2, could not constitutionally change or in any manner modify the requirements of Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution.

Accordingly you are advised that in the opinion of this office the persons appointed by the Governor to fill vacancies which occurred during recess of the Senate and since the last meeting of the Legislature, can hold such office only until "the next meeting of the Senate,"

which in our opinion means the meeting of the Senate in the special session of the Legislature convening this day; that the terms of office of such interim appointees will expire at least with the adjournment of this special session; and that the Governor has the duty of submitting to the Senate for confirmation during this special session, the names of nominees to fill the unexpired terms of such offices.

The above holding is in conformity to numerous opinions heretofore written by this office concerning related subjects and is in line with an opinion given informally to the Governor of the state of Utah in March, 1944, concerning the identical point covered in this opinion.

Gentlemen:

I have this day received a communication from the Honorable Earl J. Glade, Mayor of Salt Lake City, advising me that a vacancy exists in the Office of City Judge in Salt Lake City due to the resignation of Clifford L. Ashton, and informing me that members of the legal fraternity and important business interests were requesting the City Commission not to fill that vacancy because "there is not sufficient work in the City Courts to require four judges."

Under the laws of Utah, it is mandatory that cities with a population of 75,000 or more have four city judges. In view of the fact that there appears to be insufficient work to keep four judges busy in the largest municipality of our State, it is recommended that the law be amended so as to make it discretionary for the City Commission to determine the number of judges required to carry on the City business. This matter is important to the taxpayers of Salt Lake City, for I am advised that if the present vacancy is not required to be filled, there will be a savings of at least \$25,000 during the next four-year period.

I therefore submit this matter to you with the request that you give consideration to the recommendations that City Commissions in those communities with populations in excess of 75,000 be granted discretionary authority with respect to the number of judges to serve on city benches.

Senator Clegg moved that the bill be amended as follows:

Page 1, line 1, after the word "nine" insert the word "nineteen."

Between lines 15 and 16 insert the following:

**Sec. 19. Pledge of Property to Secure Reimbursements.**

(a) Every County Welfare Board shall require as a condition to granting assistance to any ( ) old age ( ) recipient, that all real property or interests in real property belonging to the applicant ( ) shall be pledged to the Board as a guarantee for the reimbursement of assistance received; ( ) provided, however, at the time said lien is satisfied ( ) there shall be a \$300.00 assessed valuation exemption which shall represent or equal a cash exemption value of ( ) \$750.00.

To evidence such pledge the county board shall require each applicant to enter into agreement in form approved by the State Department duly acknowledged so as to entitle it to be filed of record in the office of the County Recorder by which the applicant shall acknowledge and agree that such property has been assigned as security for the reimbursement of all assistance thereafter received by him.

If the applicant is a married man his wife shall be required to become a party to such agreement for the purpose of releasing her statutory right in such property and such release and joinder shall be as valid and effectual to release such statutory right as if she had joined the applicant in the conveyance of the property to a third person; provided, that when it appears to the County Board that the applicant is living apart from his wife and her joinder cannot be obtained, the agreement signed by the applicant alone may be accepted under such regulations as the State Department may prescribe.

Upon making a grant of old age assistance the Board shall forthwith file with the County Recorder of the county in which the applicant resides and with the County Recorder of any other county in which the applicant owns real property, a verified copy of such agreement to reimburse and the filing of the same shall have the same effect as a lien by judgment on any real property in which the applicant has any title or interest. All such real property shall from the time of filing of such copy of agreement be and become charged with a lien for all assistance received by the applicant as herein provided, which lien shall have priority over all unrecorded encumbrances. All such instruments shall be recorded in a special lien book kept for such purposes and no fees or costs shall be paid for such filing or recording.

(b) Upon the request of a recipient the Board shall execute and file with the county recorder a certificate in form approved by the State Department certifying as to the amount of assistance given the recipient to the date of such certificate. The amount so certified shall constitute the entire claim as of the date of such certificate against the real property of the recipient, and any person dealing with the recipient may rely upon such certificate as evidencing the amount of the existing lien against the real estate of the recipient.

The County Board shall seek foreclosure of the lien on a recipient's property when the property is transferred to a third party prior to the recipient's death.

Upon the death of any recipient the County Board shall present a verified claim for the total amount of all assistance given the recipient to the executor or administrator of the estate of such decedent and the same shall be allowed, approved, filed and paid as other claims in the administration of the estate of such decedent.

All money received from such estates or from the foreclosures of such lien shall be reported promptly by the Board receiving the same to the State Department and the proportion of such money which was paid to the recipient from state funds shall be remitted forthwith to the State Department.

The State Department shall certify promptly to the State Auditor a statement of the amounts received from such recipients or from their estates and deposit such collections with the State Treasurer. The Federal Government shall be entitled to and shall be paid a share of such collections equal to not more than one-half of the amount collected, if required as a condition to federal financial participation, and this amount shall be certified by the State Department to the state auditor and treasurer.

The County Board shall be empowered to accept voluntary conveyance of real property in lieu of issuance of execution. All real property acquired by the Welfare Board under the provisions of this act may be disposed of by public or private sale under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the State Department. The County Board is authorized to execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to convey title to any and all such property as may have come into its possession to a purchaser of such property as though such board constituted a corporate entity.

Effective as of July 1, 1947, all old age recipients and all those subsequently applying for assistance who are not exempt as hereinbefore provided, shall be required to enter into agreements to reimburse as hereinabove provided as a condition precedent to receiving any assistance under this act but such agreements shall constitute a charge and lien only for assistance subsequently rendered and not for assistance rendered prior to the execution of such agreements. ( )

(c) All records relating to the administration of public assistance shall be regarded as confidential and shall be protected against misuse by rules and regulations established by the Public Welfare Commission which shall have the same force and effect as law. Any person who violates the confidential nature of public assistance records as provided herein or by the rules and regulations of the Public Welfare Commission, or who assists anyone else in such violation, shall be judged guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$300 or shall be imprisoned for not more than sixty days, or both.

Neither the provisions of this Section or the rules and regulations of the Public Welfare Commission shall prohibit the State Department of Public Welfare or the County Department of Public Welfare from publishing or causing to be published such statistical material or other information of general character as Welfare Commission may consider to be of public interest. The applicant or recipient and his attorney shall at all times have the right to inspect his application or other personal records after they have been filed.

Section 10. The Public Welfare Commission, with the advice of county and district boards of public welfare, shall establish maximum standards of assistance compatible with health and well-being within the limits herein set forth, based upon studies of current living standards and costs, said standard of assistance to be applied uniformly in the determination of the need of all applicants and recipients, adjusted upward, or downward whenever cost of living index as determined by the U. S. Department of Labor shows change sufficient to warrant such adjustment, and shall reflect significant differentials in standards of liv-

ing and in cost that may exist in the various communities of the state; provided, that budgetary needs for or in behalf of any one case in any one month shall be subject to the following maximums: one-person case, \$45; two-person case, \$90; three-person case, \$114; for each additional person in a case, \$15, but the aggregate shall not exceed \$175 in any case ( ); provided further that a single recipient of old age assistance may, in addition to the amount received under the budgetary needs as above provided, receive additional income from other sources up to the amount of his personal budget as determined by the Department of Public Welfare. The foregoing maximums shall be adjusted July 1st and January 1st of each year, upward or downward in direct ratio to the increases or decreases in the cost of living as shown by the U. S. Department of Labor cost of living index in the U. S. The maximums heretofore set forth shall be considered standard as of January 1, 1947.

Permissible exceptions to the foregoing maximums for the purpose of meeting the following special costs are:

- (a) Assistance as provided for in Section 9 of this act;
- (b) Institutional and nursing home care;
- (c) Board home care;
- (d) Restaurant meals for those persons without housekeeping facilities;
- (e) Persons temporarily subjected to extraordinarily difficult problems of living by reason of their particular, special situations.

The county or district boards of public welfare may request grants in excess of the foregoing maximums, and the Public Welfare Commission is authorized to grant such requests wherever and whenever investigation discloses that the recipient and his family, because of illness, lack of employment or other unusual circumstances, needs funds in addition to the specified maximum grant to meet its minimum need for food, clothing, shelter, and fuel. Such special grants shall be reviewed monthly by the Commission.

The District or County Board may require of any recipient the beneficial use of available potential resources, and may deny assistance to an applicant other than an applicant for old age assistance who has total assets in excess of \$500.

## COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE GOVERNOR

March 13, 1948

To the Senate  
Building

Gentlemen:

A situation, concerning the exemption provided disabled war veterans from property tax under the laws of this state, has come to my attention with the request that your attention be immediately called to the matter.

The 1947 Session of the Legislature amended Sections 80-2-4 and 80-2-5, Utah Code Annotated, 1943, so as to increase the exemption from property tax for disabled veterans to a maximum of \$6,000.00. Under date of April 17, 1947 the Attorney General rendered an opinion to Mr. Edward M. Morrissey, County Attorney of Salt Lake County, to the effect that the increase in the said exemption to \$6,000.00 was unconstitutional in that it contravened Section 2 of Article 13 of the Constitution of the state of Utah, which provided a maximum exemption of \$3,000.00.

As you are aware, the 1947 Legislature provided for the taxation of property at 40% of its reasonable fair cash value. The effect of this provision, together with the unconstitutionality of the veterans' exemption provision, is to not only deny eligible veterans the \$6,000.00 maximum provided by the 1947 Legislature, but to actually reduce the \$3,000.00 exemption to 40% of that amount, or \$1,200.00.

I herewith submit to Your Honorable Body this matter and recommend the passage of legislation which will give to our disabled veterans the full amount of exemptions permitted by the Constitution.

Page 1, after the new material amending Section 10, of Chapter 89, Laws of Utah 1947 as added between lines 15 and 16 by amendment proposed by Senator Lamoreaux on the Sixth Day, add the following:

Section 19. (a) Every County Welfare Board shall require as a condition to granting assistance to any ( ) old age ( ) recipient, that all real property or interests in real property belonging to the applicant ( ) shall be pledged to the Board as a guarantee for the reimbursement of assistance received; ( ) provided, however, at the time said lien is satisfied ( ) there shall be a \$300.00 assessed valuation exemption which shall represent or equal a cash exemption value ( ) \$750.00.

To evidence such pledge the county board shall require each applicant to enter into agreement in form approved by the State Department duly acknowledged so as to entitle it to be filed of record in the office of the County Recorder by which the applicant shall acknowledge and agree that such property has been assigned as security for the reimbursement of all assistance thereafter received by him.

If the applicant is a married man his wife shall be required to become a party to such agreement for the purpose of releasing her statutory right in such property and such release and joinder shall be as valid and effectual to release such statutory right as if she had joined the applicant in the conveyance of the property to a third person; provided, that when it appears to the County Board that the applicant is living apart from his wife and her joinder cannot be obtained, the agreement signed by the applicant alone may be accepted under such regulations as the State Department may prescribe.

Upon making a grant of old age assistance the Board shall forthwith file with the County Recorder of the county in which the applicant resides and with the County Recorder of any other county in which the applicant owns real property, a verified copy of such agreement to reimburse and the filing of the same shall have the same effect as a lien by judgement on any real property in which the applicant has any title or interest. All such real property shall from the time of filing of such copy of agreement be and become charged with a lien for all assistance received by the applicant as herein provided, which lien shall have priority over all unrecorded encumbrances. All such instruments shall be recorded in a special lien book kept for such purposes and no fees or costs shall be paid for such filing or recording .

(b) Upon the request of a recipient the Board shall execute and file with the county recorder a certificate in form approved by the State Department certifying as to the amount of assistance given the recipient

to the date of such certificate. The amount so certified shall constitute the entire claim as of the date of such certificate against the real property of the recipient, and any person dealing with the recipient may rely upon such certificate as evidencing the amount of the existing lien against the real estate of the recipient.

The County Board shall seek foreclosure of the lien on a recipient's property when the property is transferred to a third party prior to the recipient's death.

Upon the death of any recipient the County Board shall present a verified claim for the total amount of all assistance given the recipient to the executor or administrator of the estate of such decedent and the same shall be allowed, approved, filed and paid as other claims in the administration of the estate of such decedent.

All money received from such estates or from the foreclosures of such lien shall be reported promptly by the Board receiving the same to the State Department and the proportion of such money which was paid to the recipient from state funds shall be remitted forthwith to the State Department.

The State Department shall certify promptly to the State Auditor a statement of the amounts received from such recipients or from their estates and deposit such collections with the State Treasurer. The Federal Government shall be entitled to and shall be paid a share of such collections equal to not more than one-half of the amount collected, if required as a condition to federal financial participation, and this amount shall be certified by the State Department to the state auditor and treasurer.

The County Board shall be empowered to accept voluntary conveyance of real property in lieu of issuance of execution. All real property acquired by the Welfare Board under the provisions of this act may be disposed of by public or private sale under such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the State Department. The County Board is authorized to execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to convey title to any and all such property as may have come into its possession to a purchaser of such property as though such board constituted a corporate entity.

Effective as of July 1, 1947, all old age recipients and all those subsequently applying for assistance who are not exempt as hereinbefore provided, shall be required to enter into agreements to reimburse as hereinabove provided as a condition precedent to receiving any assistance under this act but such agreements shall constitute a charge and lien only for assistance subsequently rendered and not for assistance rendered prior to the execution of such agreements. ( )

(c) All records relating to the administration of public assistance shall be regarded as confidential and shall be protected against misuse by rules and regulations established by the Public Welfare Commission which shall have the same force and effect as law. Any person who violates the confidential nature of public assistance records as provided

herein or by the rules and regulations of the Public Welfare Commission, or who assists anyone else in such violation, shall be judged guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$300 or shall be imprisoned for not more than sixty days, or both.

Neither the provisions of this Section or the rules and regulations of the Public Welfare Commission shall prohibit the State Department of Public Welfare or the County Department of Public Welfare from publishing or causing to be published such statistical material or other information of general character as Welfare Commission may consider to be of public interest. The applicant or recipient and his attorney shall at all times have the right to inspect his application or other personal records after they have been filed.

Section 30. If a recipient or applicant is a divorced or estranged spouse or a child of a divorced or estranged spouse, the public welfare department and the county welfare boards shall investigate why such recipient or applicant is not being supported by said divorced spouse. In the event the divorced or estranged spouse or parent of the recipient or applicant is not rendering adequate support, the public welfare department shall take such action, criminal, civil or otherwise, to require such divorced or estranged spouse or parent to support such child; provided, such action is not detrimental to such child.

For the purpose of enforcing this section and upon filing an affidavit setting forth the facts bringing such parent or spouse within this section, the state department of public welfare shall be a party to divorce proceedings involving the recipient or parent of a recipient.

## REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

March 17, 1948

Mr. President :

Mr. Speaker :

We, the Special Joint Committee appointed to study the provisions of the welfare bills heretofore passed by the Senate and by the House and to make procedural recommendations to the Legislature relative thereto, beg leave to report as follows :

In our efforts to correlate the past actions of the two bodies we have studied their expressed purposes as evidenced by the two bills which have cleared the House and Senate and the sentiment as we understand it concerning them. As a result, we recommend that the House take up for consideration *S. B. No. 23*, and we recommend its adoption subject to the following amendments. Exceptions taken by committee members to specific sections or proposals are herein noted :

Section 19. (The section relating to over-all lien provision) is recommended by the Committee with Senator Selvin registering objection thereto.

Section 31. (Relating to the matter of home ownership being considered as a resource.) The Joint Committee was not agreed on the advisability of recommending the provisions of this Section. It was, therefore, decided this matter be resolved in open debate on the House floor, and the Joint Committee recommends that the Senate concur in the action of the House whatever that action may be relative to this particular section.

Section 32. We find a motion was made but not acted upon or not recorded in the Senate to strike the first sentence from the second paragraph of Section 32. We concur and recommend the House act to accomplish this.

Section 35. The Committee is unanimous in recommending the adoption of the sum of \$500,000.00 to complete this fiscal year. The majority of the Committee, six members, concurred in the sum of \$500,000.00 for the second year. However, Senator Day stands for a maximum of \$440,000.00; Senator Vest and Representative White favor an appropriation of \$900,000.00 for the last fiscal year; Senator Selvin \$1,300,000.00. The quarterly allotment of \$1,700,000.00 should be amended by the House to be the equivalent of one-fourth of \$6,360,000.00, the amount appropriated in the regular session plus one-quarter of the amount which is finally approved by the House for the last fiscal year. It is further agreed that in the event the House amend the bill to include a residence provision, the Joint Committee recommends that the Senate concur therein.

If the certificate shows a lesser percentage of disability the exemption allowed shall be that percentage of ( ) three thousand ( ) (\$3,000.) dollars. This amount shall be allowed regardless of the amount of property owned by the person receiving the exemption, except that no exemptions shall be allowed for any disability below twenty-five per cent. Widows and minor orphans of deceased veterans shall be entitled to the full exemption.

To the Members of the Twenty-Seventh  
Legislature—Special Session

Gentlemen:

We think it would be well before adjournment to have your records show the legislative intent on two features embodied in the new welfare act; namely, on liens and on residential requirements.

Is it the intent to have these two provisions apply only to future applicants after the law becomes effective, or should it apply to all those who are now on the rolls who would not meet the qualifications set forth if they were applying after the bill goes into effect?

We have on our rolls at the present time some 7000 recipients who own property on which there is no lien. If the law is to apply only to future applicants, it will have but very little effect. The same thing applies to a much lesser extent to residential requirements. There are many people on the rolls at the present time who have not lived in the State of Utah one year.

We would appreciate very much having these two features clarified so that there will be no question as to legislative intent.
