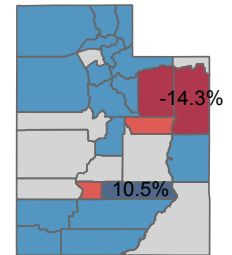
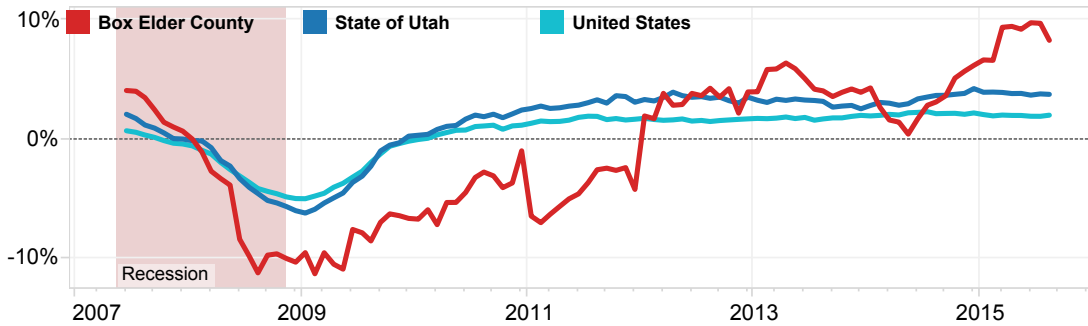
Year-to-Year Change in Nonfarm Jobs MARCH 2016*

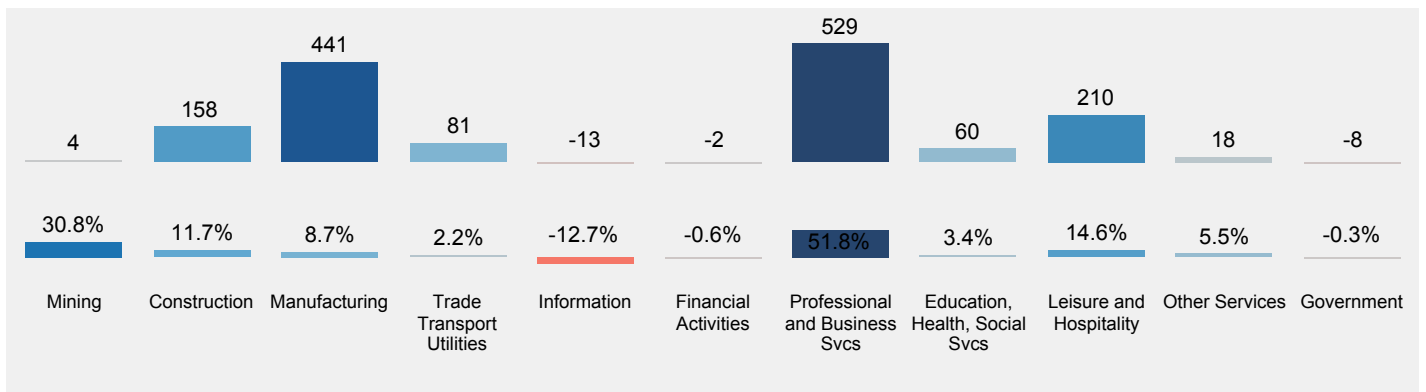

How's the economy?

Box Elder County continues to exceed expectations with over 8 percent employment growth in the first quarter 2016. Taxable sales were up for the seventh consecutive quarter with strength in retail and wholesale markets. Unemployment remained low, initial unemployment insurance claims are back to pre-recession levels and construction activity is consistently strong.

Jobs

Box Elder County added 1,478 new jobs, growing 8.3 percent year-over since March 2015 - this makes six straight months of employment growth above 8 percent.

The professional/business services industry led job growth, adding 529 new jobs over the last year primarily due to gains in employment services and management of companies.

Employment gains in specialty trade contracting - particularly foundation contractors (construction), and fabricated metal product manufacturing were also notable, adding 248, and 222 new jobs to the county respectively.

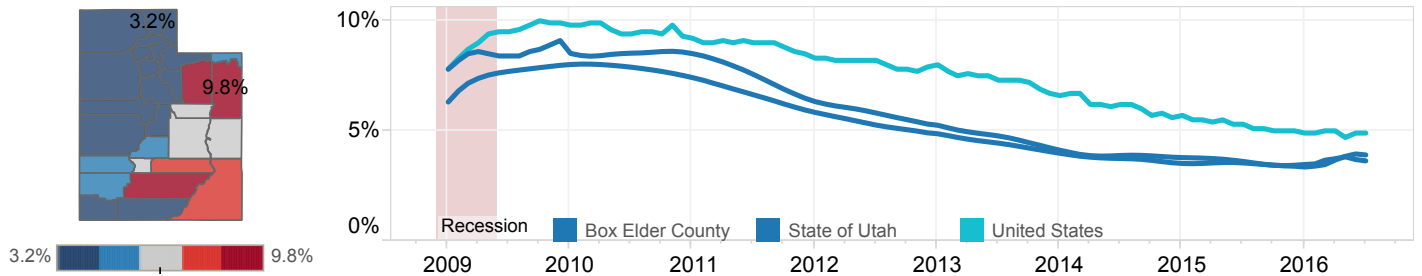

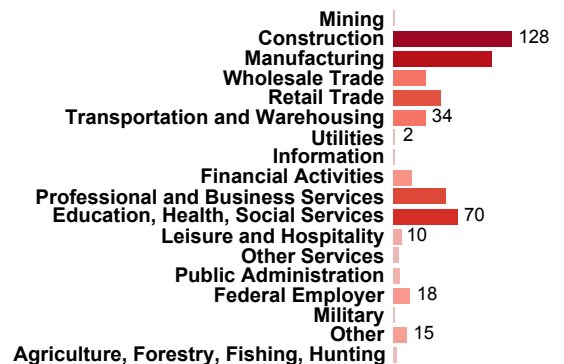
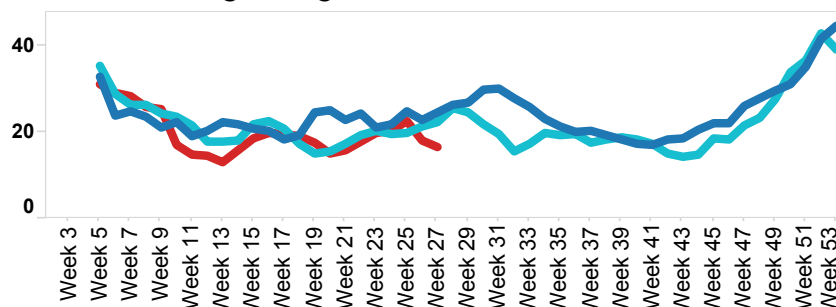


Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance

Four-Week Moving Average

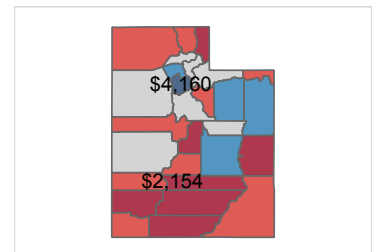
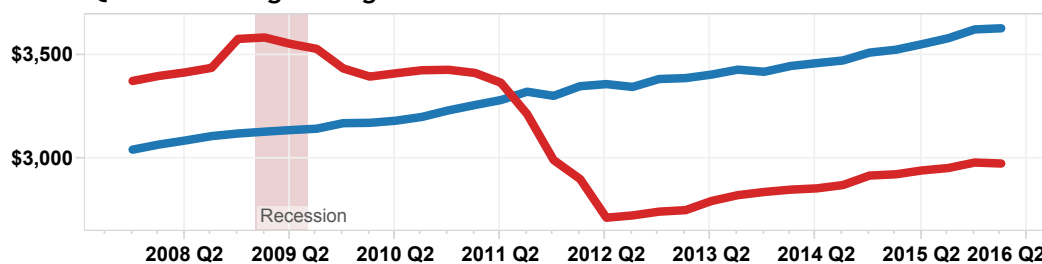

Unemployment and Wages

Box Elder County's unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in July 2016. It has been at approximately the same level since this time last year and is just below the state average of 3.9 percent.



Initial claims for unemployment insurance are averaging around 16 per week as of mid-August 2016. Levels have not been this low in Box Elder since 2007.



Box Elder County average wages fell slightly in the first quarter 2016 by -0.7 percent since first quarter 2015, decreasing to \$2,909 per month on average.



The wage contraction is being driven primarily by the employment services industry where total employment is growing quickly and, as a result, is increasing the share of staffing agency and temporary employment jobs where wages tend to be lower.

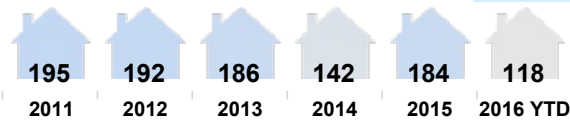

Construction Permitting JANUARY-JUNE 2016

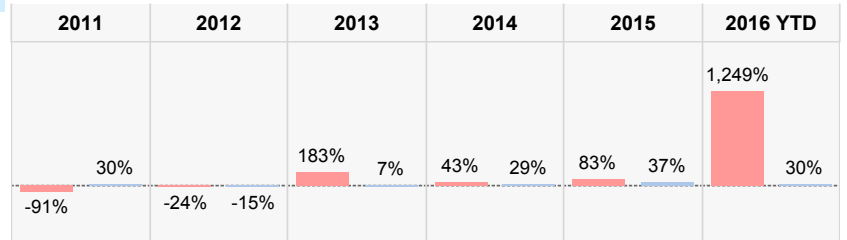

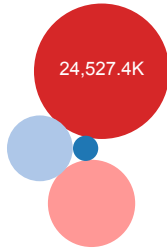

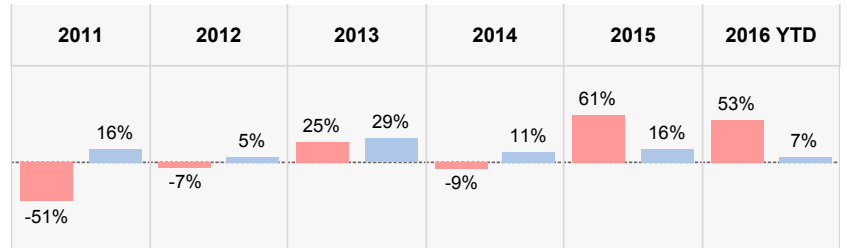

Year-to-Year Change In Gross Taxable Sales FIRST QUARTER 2016

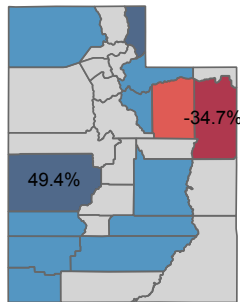

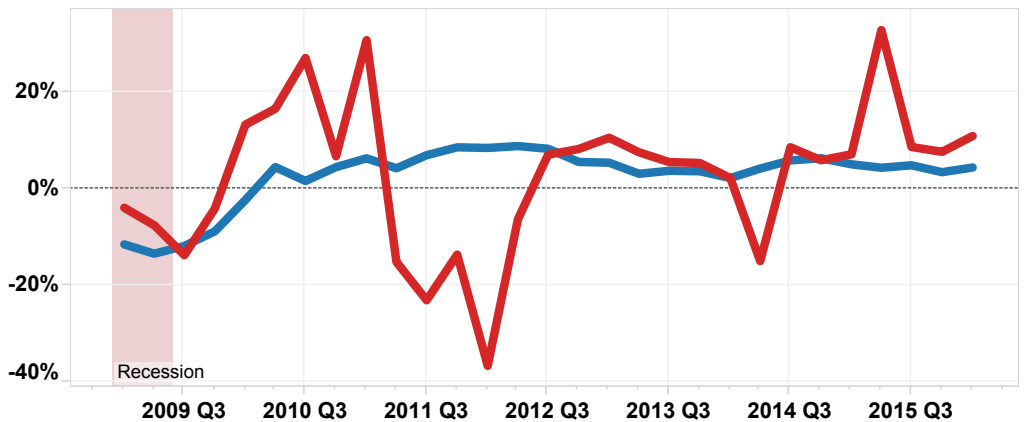

Construction and Sales

Residential construction is starting strong in 2016 with year-to-date permitted units as of June increasing by 11 percent over the YTD number in June 2015.

The value of permitted nonresidential construction has also increased substantially - by over 1,000 percent compared to first half of 2015, thanks largely to a new hotel that has been permitted for construction.

Taxable sales in Box Elder County increased 10.9 percent year-over in Q1 2016, reaching more than \$161 million.

Consumer spending increased with total retail sales gaining nearly \$3 million over Q1 2015, but wholesale trade in durable goods is where the largest gains occurred with a more than \$4 million increase over last year. Strong wholesale performance tends to reveal..
